

Justin Sheftel Memorial Scholarship Award



One \$5,000 Scholarship Awarded

Application Deadline is April 10th, 2020

In June 2005, a drunk driver tragically killed Justin Sheftel. The Justin Sheftel Memorial Scholarship Award has been established to honor and remember Justin's life. The ideal candidate for this scholarship would possess many of the characteristics and qualities that Justin exemplified in his life. ***We are looking for the uncommon hero; a hard worker, reliable friend, and determined student.*** For example, one of his best friends presented the scholarship, and we felt best put into words the type of candidate that would meet these qualifications.

"This award is an un-common award. What makes this scholarship unique is that when looking for the most deserving candidate, one must take a step back and recite the acronym "WWJD"- What Would Justin Do? He worked hard in everything he did and received good grades, Sat scores, but it didn't stop there. He worked hard for everything, and even if he wasn't a natural, he worked to develop his skills- not only in sports but also in all aspects of life. He was the first of my friends to ever hold a paying job. Interested candidates must:

- Be a senior who will be graduating from Dieruff in June 2020 and attending a College or University in the fall of 2020
- Have been active on an Athletic Team (club level or freshman/JV/Varsity).
- Have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or better
- Have Financial Need
- Have been involved in extra-curricular activities, community service, or an after school/summer job
- Complete the attached application
- Submit three letters of recommendation pertaining to the applicant's character and personality; at least two should be from teachers or a guidance counselor.
- Submit an Essay, no more than 650 words, on the following *PROMPT: Tell us about yourself; how you feel you best portray those characteristics that were recognized in Justin by his peers on page 1 of the application. Explain how you have a passion for something and have continued to pursue, learn, and explore to become better at what you do and love.*

Instructions - Application

Interested students should complete and submit to the counseling office no later than **April 10th, 2020**.

Letters of recommendation should be enclosed in a sealed envelop with the student's name noted either with your application or sent directly to the Counseling office.

A committee of family members, teachers, a close friend of Justin's, and guidance counselors will determine the Scholarship winner.

The award will be presented during the academic awards ceremony.
