COMMUNITY BIKE WORKS

Community Bike Works teaches life lessons through bicycles to the young people of the Lehigh Valley who would benefit most. At our three bike shops and in community schools across the Lehigh Valley, youth

join our flagship Earn a Bike and Junior Earn a Bike programs to learn bicycle mechanics while also learning life skills from teamwork to communication. Once engaged at Bike Works, students can participate in a range of cycling and youth leadership programs from the ages of seven to 18. In Earn a Bike, students team up with adult mentors for 24 hours of instruction in bike mechanics and safety, learning about each system of a bike and how to properly maintain it using the correct tools. Students also complete bike safety lessons and a 'rodeo' designed to show they can ride safely. While working on their bikes, students practice life skills by working collaboratively, solving problems, and experiencing the satisfaction of turning a broken bike into a functional one. Once students complete their month-long classes, they earn their refurbished bike and a new helmet! Community Bike Works has engaged more than 7,200 students since 1995, and we are now one of the largest youth bike mentoring programs in the nation. In 2024, we plan to engage up to 600 students in our Earn a Bike and Junior Earn a Bike programs, keeping them engaged in our additional enrichment programs like weekend bike rides and our Youth Advisory Council. Additionally, we will serve 300 or more families each month at our new East Allentown food pantry. Our work this year will culminate in June 2024 when we host the national Youth Bike Summit, which will bring 400 young people to the Lehigh Valley for three days of workshops and bike rides.



We are deeply grateful and cherish the partnership we've maintained with the Justin Sheftel Memorial Fund over their long history, and we are excited to work together and engage with more kids on bikes throughout the Lehigh Valley in 2024!
